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The Lexington Public Schools (LPS), in partners with parents, guardians, and the community, and in keeping with the LPS covalue of respect for human differences, believes that a positive, safe, and civil environment in school is neces frame tudents to learn and achieve. Bullying is conduct that can disrupt a student's

Cyber-bullying shall also incide the distribution by electronimeans of a communication to more than one person or the posting of materiatin electronic medium that may be accessed by one or more persons, if the distribution ortiposcreates any of theoreticions enumerated in the definition of bullying.

Bullying and cyber-bullying can occur in and tood school, during and after school hours, at home and in locations outside and home. When bullying and locations are alleged, the full cooperation and assistance of parents or disease and their families are expected.

For the purpose of this policy, whenever the t**buth**ying is used, it is to denote either bullying, or cyber-bullying.

Bullying is prohibited:

- on school grounds;
- on property immediately adjacent to school grounds;
- at school-sponsored or schoolated activities, functions or off school grounds;
- at school bus stops;
- on school buses or other vehicles ownedsed or used by the school district; or,
- through the use of technology and electronic device owned assed or used by the LPS;

Bullying and cyber-bullying are prohibited at acadion, activity, function oprogram that is not school-related or through the use of technologymoelectronic device that not owned, leased or used by the LPS if the act or acts in question:

- create a hostile learning d/or social environment at school for the target;
- infringe on the rights of the target at school; and/or
- materially and substantially disrupt the **ealti**on process or the orderly operation of a school.

Prevention and Intervention Plan

The superintendent or designee shall oversædehvelopment of a prention and intervention plan, in consultation with all district stahkelders, which may include parents and guardians, teachers, school staff, professional suppersonnel, school volunteers, administrators, community representatives, locaw enforcement agencies, and students, consistent with the requirements of this policy, as well as state federal laws. The bullying prevention and intervention plan shable reviewed and updated least biennially.

A principal or designee is responsible for timplementation and oversight of the bullying prevention and implementation within his or her school.

Reporting

Students who believe that they are a targetudlying are encouraged and urged to report the matter to a member of the school staff. Stustevito observe an act of bullying, or who have reasonable grounds to believe that these behavire taking place, are obligated to report

incidents to a member of the school staff, and breasubject to discipline for failing to report such incidents. However, the targetall not be subject to discipline failing to report bullying.

A member of a school staff shall immediated port to the school principal or designee any instance of suspected bullying that member has witnessed excome aware of. If the staff member fails to do so, he or she may be subject to disciplinary action.

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Parents or guardians, or members of the conity unre encouraged to report an incident of suspected bullying as soon as sible to a school principal.

11 Each school shall have a means for anonymeousting by students of incidents of suspected

Disciplinary actions for students who are found to have committed an act of bullying or retaliation shall be in accordance with LPS disciplinary policies.

<u>Assistance</u>

The LPS may provide appropriateunseling or referral to approximate services, including, but not limited to, guidance, academic interventions protection to any affected students, as necessary.

Documentation

Each school shall document ain grident of bullying that is seported per this policy, and the principal or a designee shall mainta file of these reports.

The superintendent or designee shall inform Stoke ool Committee periodically of any trends or implications of these reports in order to gthe School Committee the opportunity to review and amend this policy.

Confidentiality shall be maintained consistewith the school'sobligations under law.

21 Retaliation

Reprisal or retaliation againstyaperson associated with a report bullying or the investigation thereof is prohibited. Disciplinary action for the investigation thereof is prohibited.

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
